200 Hurt In Boston Subway Panic

UNDERGROUND CAR BELCHES FORTH FLAMES
Explosion Under Seat Traps 30 in Car as Fire Starts
PANIC SPREADS TO SUBWAY STATION

Passengers Caught in Car, Break Windows to Escape from Smoke
BOSTON, Mass., Jan. 3.—Thirty persons trapped and burned or trampled in a subway car at the underground Park street station today started a panic in which 200 persons were slightly injured.

Investigation revealed pieces of motion picture film near where the explosion occurred. A police officer believed that the film, accidentally ignited, caused the fire.
There was instant panic, not only in the car, but in the subway station. Persons milling about to escape fought with those entering the subway.
