DES MOINES, Jan. 5.—Senator A. II Bergman of Newton, is drafting a gasoline fax bill to be introduced in the Joya legislature soon after its convening

The Bergman bill would fix a 'tax of two cents a gallon on all gasoline.


DRESSER SHOWS QUALITY OF MODERN CONSTRUCTION
