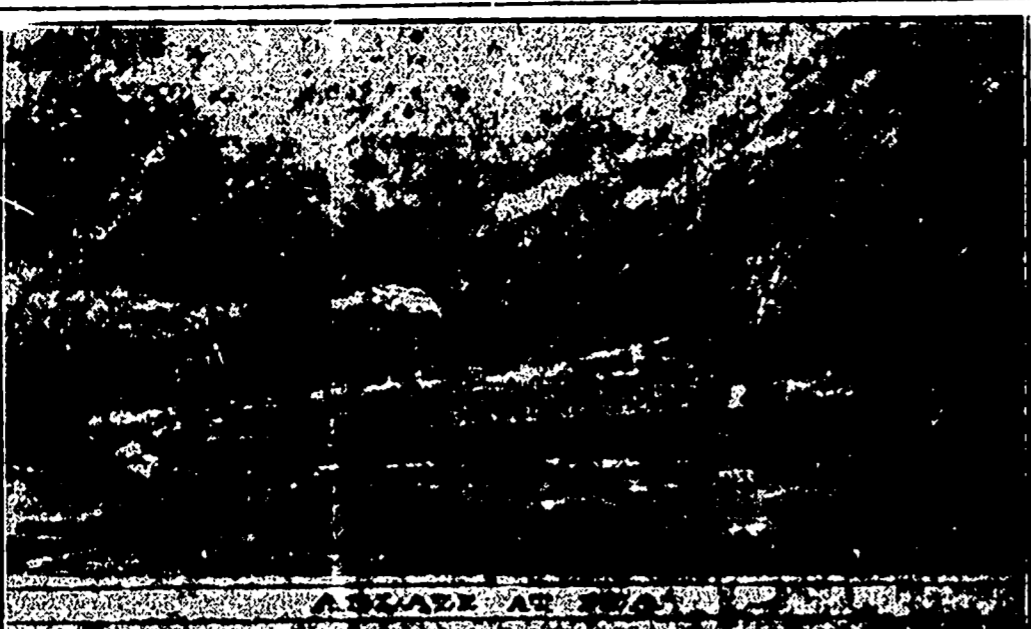


OPERATED CAR FORTY YEARS, NO ACCIDENT
