The production of pictures gives employment to a permanent roll of 300,000 folk. The average number of feature pictures yearly produced in the United States is now about 700. In the aggregate the salaries paid amount to \$75,000,000 a year. In the course of a twelve-month the producers of pictures pay out \$5.000,000 to the newspapers and magazines for advortising and \$7,000,000 more for photos and cuts.
