The illustration shows the proposed home of the Merchants National bank, which ill be erected on the site of the Kimball building, Second avenue at Third street.

Every office in the building will be an outside croom, equipped with large windows of rolled steel, glazed with plate glass. The space will be sub-divided to suit the individual needs of the tenants and in this connection it is planned to make special provision for occupancy of certain floors by members of the legal and medical professions If there is sufficient demand one or two floors will be set aside for rental to doctors and dentists, these rooms being fitted with special equipment and facilities where a check of stolen goods was made, it is reported.
