Six Hundred Members Local Council With Their Families Enjoy Supper and Entertainment.

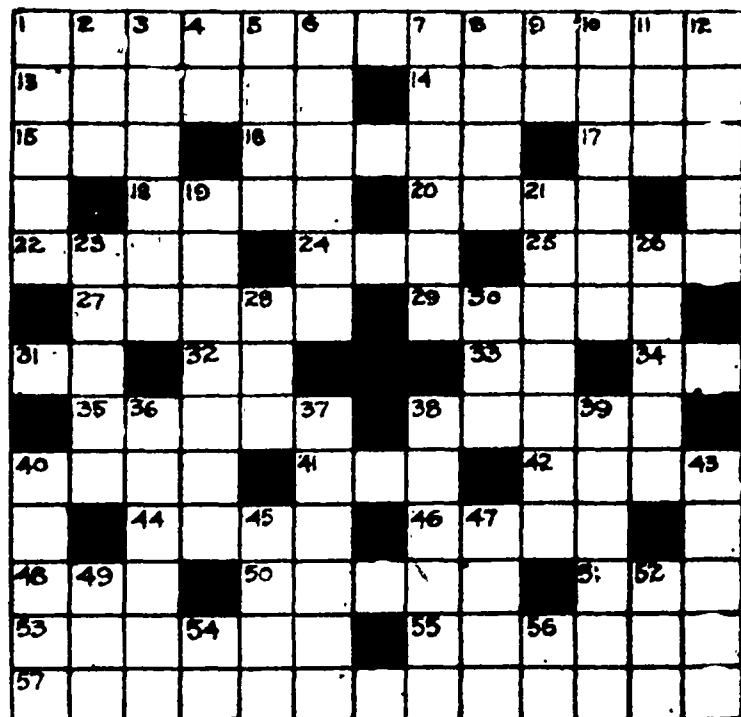
Dreamland ballroom was the scene of revelry last night when the annual winter frolic of Council 909, Knights of Columbus, was held there.

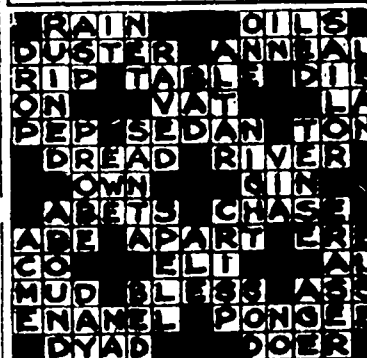
OUR CROSS-WORD PUZZLE

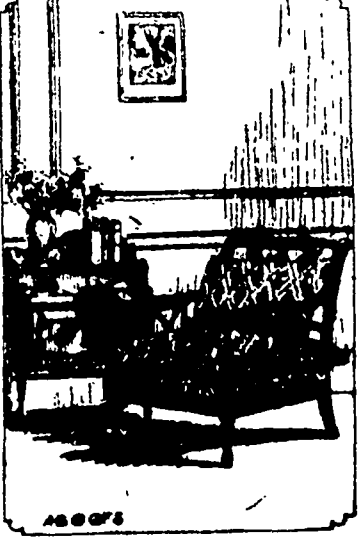

A PAINTED CHAIR.

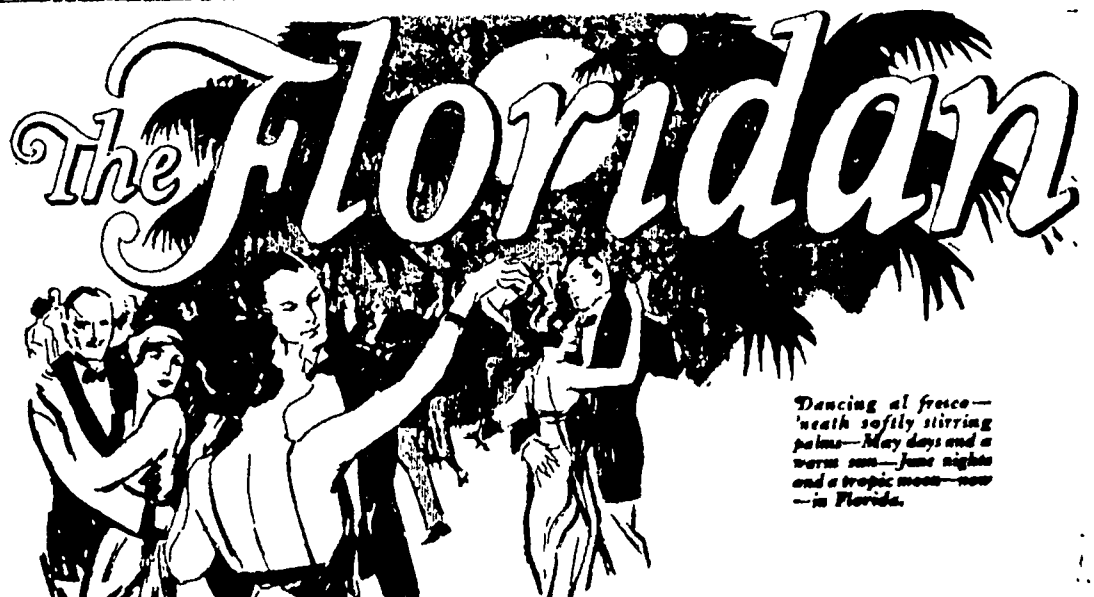
