## Illegal Fishermen Pay Iowa Big Sum For Violating Laws

**DES MOINES, Jan. 9.**—(By Associated Press.)—One thousand one hundred and ninety-three Iowa trappers, trappers and fishermen paid \$28,639.90 in fines and \$5,190.81 in costs and served 181 days in jail on conviction of violations of the state fish and game laws during the two year period ending June 30, 1924, according to the biennial report of W. E. Allen, state game warden made to the governor.
