

#### **CEDAR COUNTY GETS** FOOT, MOUTH SCARE

Federal And State Vets At Tipton Farm; Diagnosis Not Announced But

Plague Unlikely.

TIPTON, Jan 12--Considerable at tention among farmers of Cedar county has been turned toward the outbreak in a herd of cattle recently purchased by Tom Sephew and J t. Ross, farmers south of Tipton

The nature of the disease is on vhich affects the mouth and tongue of the infected animals and it is re ported that six animals showed signs of being affected when examined by he veterinarians

Rumors are numerous and many farmers are worried about another foot and mouth disease epidemic as was experienced by farmers here a few years ago. Many entire herds at that time were slaughtered and a lose quarantine was exercised over the entire county. This, of course

the entire county. This, of course, prevented many farmers from selling livestock on the public markets, and incurred great financial loss.

Dr Peter Malcolm, state veterinarian of Des Moines, Dr J A Barger of the department of animal in dustry. Des Moines, and Dr L. M Buffington of Cedar Rapids, are keening deep witch of the structure. keeping close watch of the situation So far no statements have been made by them, but is thought that by local persons acquainted with the disease that this is not hoof and mouth.

#### RETTER TODAY.

Foderal and state veterinarians were again at the Nephew and Ross were again at the Nephew and Ross farm today attempting to diagnose the disease which some feared might be foot and mouth. No statements were issued by them this morning. Over long distance telephone Mr. Ross told The Evening Gazette that both horses and cattle were affected on his farm and that veterinariais had attempted to infect hogs by vaccination. It is said the disease does not show up for nine days after innot show up for nine days after in-fection and the results in the hoz experiment will not be known for

some time. Mr Ross said he believed the ailment was slackening today and that it would not prove to be foot and mouth disease.
