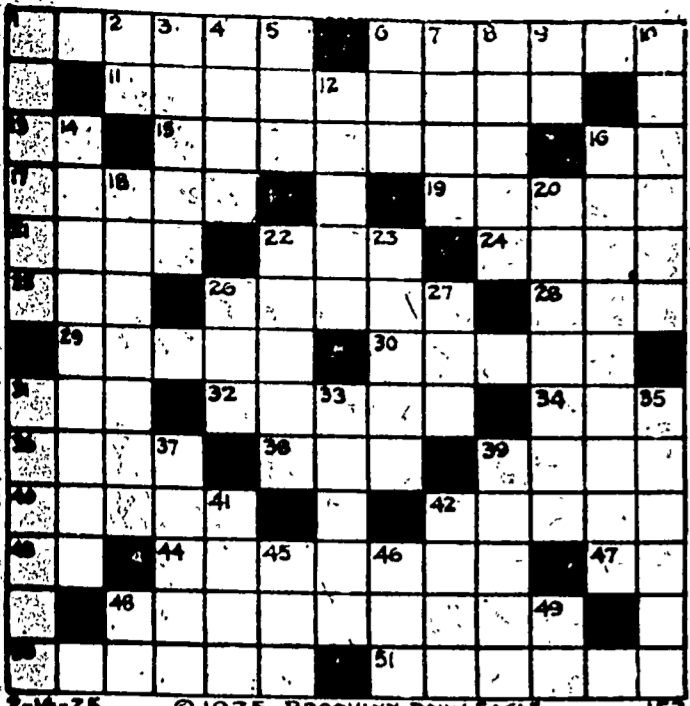

It has grown out of a movement started in the local Congregational church which in an early day was a Welsh church and which at the present time fosters many of the old traditions. The Elsteddfod has been regarded as the Welsh people as their national festival and musical fest, and dates back to the time when the barons went from castle to castle indulging in their innate love of music and poetry. The local musicians have always been interested in these gatherings as they have been held over the state, and they have many times captured the highest prizes. The local Elsteddfod will hold two sessions April 17, one in the afternoon and the other in the evening. Prizes are offered in recitation, vocal solos, cornet solos, duets and quartets. CONSERVATION SCHOOL AT AMES THIS WEEK

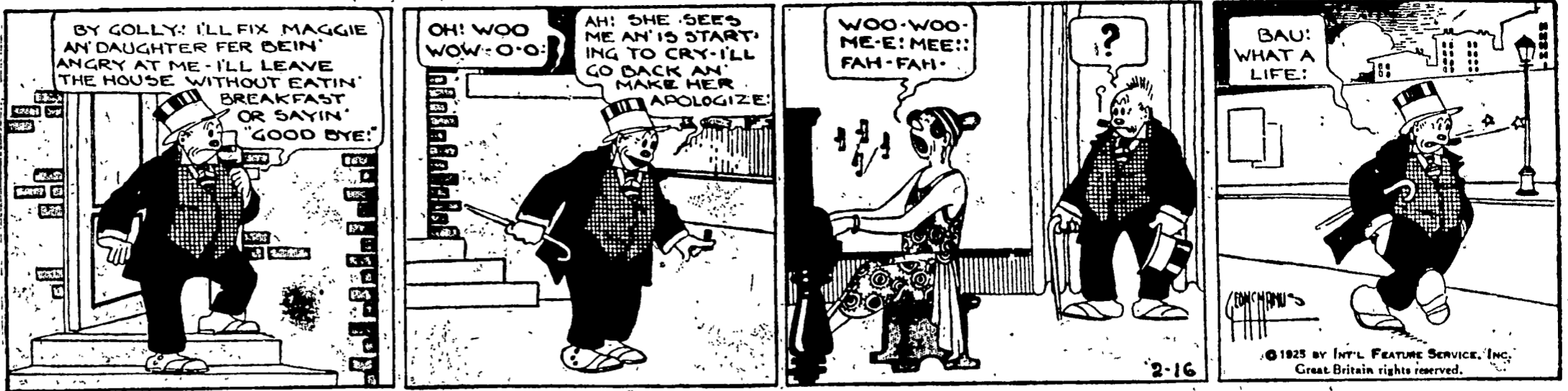

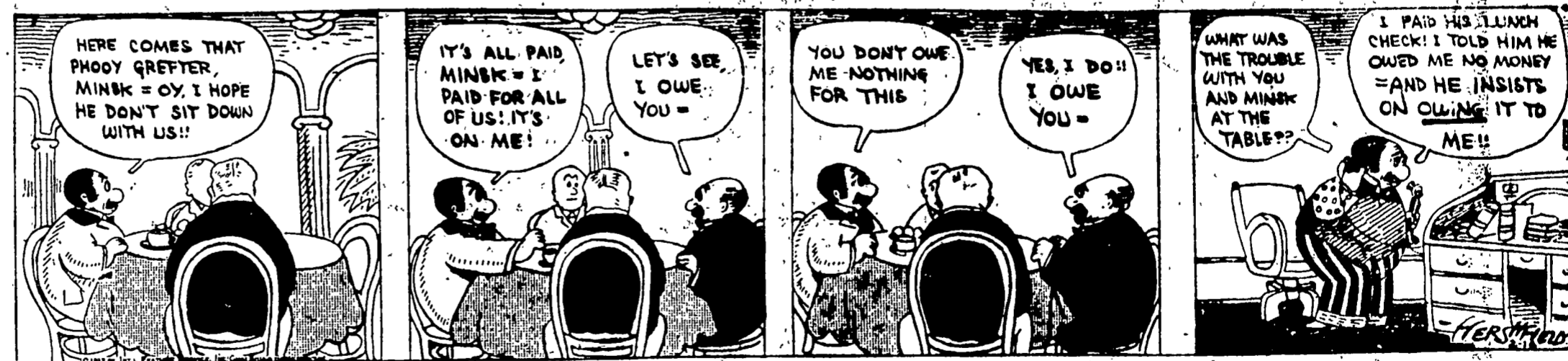

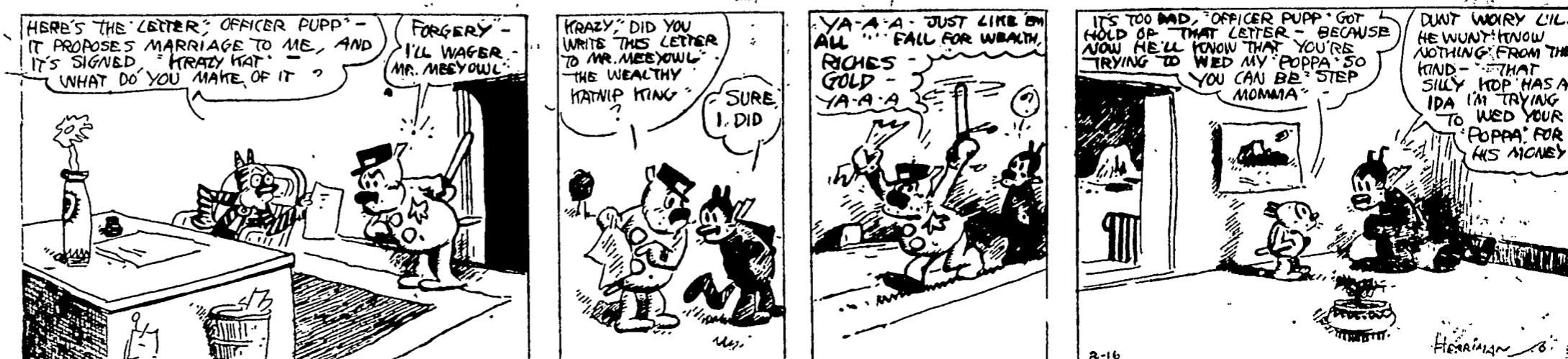
