### Much Traveled.

A world traveler for thirty years, Dr Mott knows international condi-tions as do few other private citizens of this country - He has been around the world many times and in some years made two trips abroad. He vis-ited twelve countries on his last journey, which included the Mediter-ranean nations, Dr Mott was a member of the Mexican commission appointed by President Wilson in 1916 and the next year was sent to Russia by President Wilson on a special diplomatic commission. During the World war, he was secretary of the national war work council of the Y, M C A and it was under his personal direction that the association was extended to all the allied

"I do not agree with the French writer who says Europe is dying, but it is extremely sick," said Dr Mott He characterized the world's economical situation as "Impossible," pointed out the political distempers. He lauded the league of nations for seeking to alleviate the physical ills in addition to others, and regretted the survival of pre-war prejudices. Sees Hope In Orient.


