CEDAR RAPIDS SECOND IN BUILDING PERMITS

DES MOINES, Feb. 23—Des Moines led all other Iowa cities during January in the valuation of buildings for which permits were issued according to the monthly report of the Iowa bureau of labor. The valuation here was \$282,580.

The report also shows that the state employment offices placed 2,023 men and women during the month. The Des Moines office placed 618 men and 429 women. Slou City 582 men and 391 women and Creston, three men. Of the total number 143 men and nine women were placed in farm work.

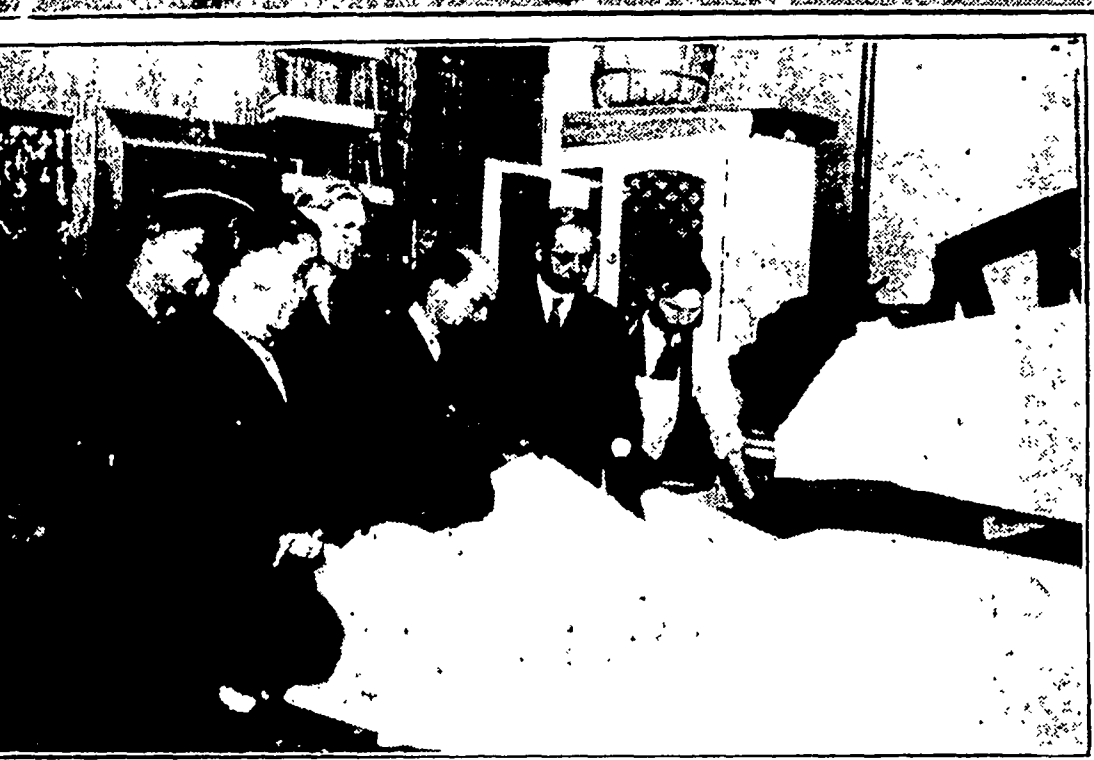

Scenes At Indiana's Greatest Mine Disaster



An explosion of gas in the mines of the City Coal company at Sullivan, Indiana, took a toll of fifty-one lives, February 20. After sixteen of the bodies had been taken out of the death pit, the rescuers were blocked in their efforts of recovering the remaining 35 bodies by the occurrence of a cave-in and the blocking of the ventilating system with "afterdamp," the dreaded poison gas of the mining industry.

Mine experts say a cutting machine, working close to the wall of an abandoned mine, cut through a partition releasing a flood of gas that had accumulated in the old working. A flame from a miner's lamp ignited the gas and caused the blast. Forces of rescuers from the surrounding mines are working against heavy odds to recover all the victims.

PHOTO NO. 1 SHOWS—ambulances lined up at the mouth of the disastrous mine shaft at Sullivan, Indiana, waiting to carry away the victims recovered from the underground death chambers. The bodies are placed in the morgue and undertaking parlor at Sullivan where the grief-stricken kin identify their dead.

PHOTO NO. 2 SHOWS—relatives of mine victims seeking to identify their dead among the first six teen bodies brought up from the tragic mine. The task of identifying the victims is made extremely difficult on account of the charred condition of the bodies.
