



# Scenes At Indiana's Greatest Mine Disaster





An explosion of gas in the mines of the City Coal company at Sullivan Indiana took a toll of fifty-one lives, February 20. After sixteen of the bedies had been taken out of the death pit, the rescurers were blocked in their efforts of recovering the remaining 35 bodies by the occurence of a cave in and the blocking of the ventilating system with 'afterdamp," the dreaded poison gas of the mining industry Mine experts say a cutting machine, working close to the wall of an abandoned mine, cut through a partition releasing a flood of gas that had accumulated in the old working. A flame from a miner's lamp ignited the gas and caused the blast. Forces of rescuers from the surrounding mines are working against heavy odds to recover all the victims.
