

## Bohemians And Gordon Sisters Put Lots Of Life In Majestic Bill

Marked by pep and variety, Raymond's Bohemians, headlining the new bill at the Majestic, in a musical and dance act, made a hit with the first nighters who applauded them for an encore. ### IOWA CITY AT POLLS TO ELECT NEW MAYOR

IOWA CITY, March 30.—With one of the closest contests in years expected, Iowa City went to the polls today to choose its mayor for the next two years.

Miss Emma J. Harvat, who for the last three years has served as the city's chief executive, is seeking reelection on the republican ticket. She is opposed by J. J. Carroll, local business man, the democratic nominee.

Two other women are among the candidates in today's election. Miss Ruth Gallagher is one of the democratic nominees for alderman-at-large, and Mrs. J. J. Lambert is the republican candidate for Fourth ward alderman. One candidate, James Aldous, jr., republican nominee for park commissioner is unopposed.

Registration for the election in the five wards of the city totaled 8,826.

### CENSUS AT IOWA CITY INDICATES BIG GROWTH

IOWA CITY, March 30.—Iowa City's population has shown an increase of almost 30 per cent in the last five years, it is estimated on the basis of incomplete returns from the city census now in progress. With three of the five wards completed, an estimate of the population based on incomplete figures from the other wards fixes the number at about 14,600. In 1920 census figures showed that Iowa City had 11,267 inhabitants.

This represents a gain of 3,332, or 29.56 per cent. In addition to the fixed population, there are about 6,000 students of the University of Iowa who spend a large part of the year here.
