

## B. AND P. V. BOOKLET TO ADVERTISE CITY

Student Musicians Going To Kansas City Contest Will Carry Books Telling Of Cedar Rapids' Assets.

More than 3,500 copies of a booklet about Cedar Rapids, featuring especially its public school music department, will be distributed among notables from all over the country at Kansas City soon, through the enterprise of the local business and Professional Women's club.

The booklets, designed, prepared and paid for by this club, will be taken to Kansas City by students of Washington high school competing in a mid-west high school music contest April 3, at the national conference of music supervisors. They will be given out to the delegates, representing practically every state in the union and several foreign countries, by the boys and girls.

Twenty-eight pages of pictures, printed matter and advertisements are contained in the 4 by 7 booklet. It is artistically designed, printed in brown ink on India tint paper. On the two outer covers is a picture of the several hundred children of the junior high school orchestras, with their instruments.

Facts about Cedar Rapids, with a fine view of the First avenue bridge, are included in the contents. There are also cuts of the glee clubs and orchestra entered in the contest, of Arthur Deamer, superintendent of schools, Miss Alice Inskeep, music supervisor, Maj. Frederick Doetzel, director of the orchestra, Miss Olive Parker, director of glee clubs, and David Turner, high school teacher. Supt. Deamer contributed an article, and other matter was compiled by the club.

Mrs. Edwin Hetherington, president of the B. and P. V. club, and Miss Grace Boston, a former president, shared the responsibility of preparing the booklet.
