

APPEALS TO WOMEN TO PRESERVE PEACE

Prof. B. F. Shambaugh Tells
League of Voters World
Conflict Led Only To
Greater Armaments.

DES MOINES, April 13.—(By Associated Press).—War, "the thing that threatens to strangle civilization and destroy humanity itself," must be banished from the earth, and the abolishment of war is "the problem of problems now confronting mankind," Prof. Benjamin P. Shambaugh of the University of Iowa, declared today in an address before the annual convention of the Iowa League of Women Voters.

The world war which was fought to end war, "did not destroy the thing it aimed to kill," Prof. Shambaugh said, and has "incidentally provoked still greater military establishments and vastly more destructive armaments."

He who doubts that war has proved the greatest hindrance to human progress was invited by Mr. Shambaugh to "read the history of the world."

"War is conflict to the death between classes, communities, races, and nations," Mr. Shambaugh continued. "It is the result largely of differences growing out of class jealousy, community isolation, race prejudice, overstimulated nationalism and popular misunderstanding. Its methods are primitive, uncivilized, brutal."

"Opposed to the methods of war as a way of settling differences are the more rational methods of conference, adjudication and legislation. And so, for the prevention of war and the maintenance of peace, let us encourage the holding of race congresses, the establishment of leagues of nations, the setting up of international courts and even the organization of a world state."

**STARBUCK HAS PLAN TO
MAKE HIGHWAYS PRETTY**

IOWA CITY, April 13.—By planting berry bushes, fruit trees and grape vines along the highways of Iowa, Prof. Edwin D. Starbuck of the University of Iowa believes the roadsides may be made so attractive that tourists will drive 300 to 400 miles out of their way to visit Iowa. "Beauty can be combined with utility," in this matter of highway park extension, Prof. Starbuck said. "Iowa's rich soil and wonderful growing climate will make the highways beautiful if the proper attention is given them."

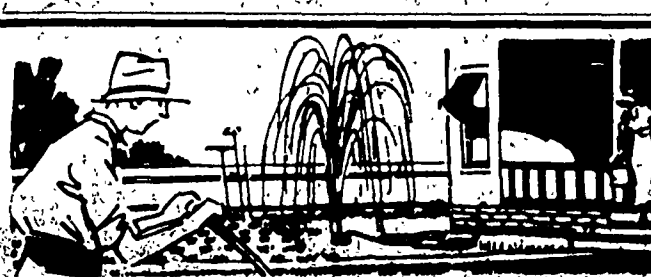
