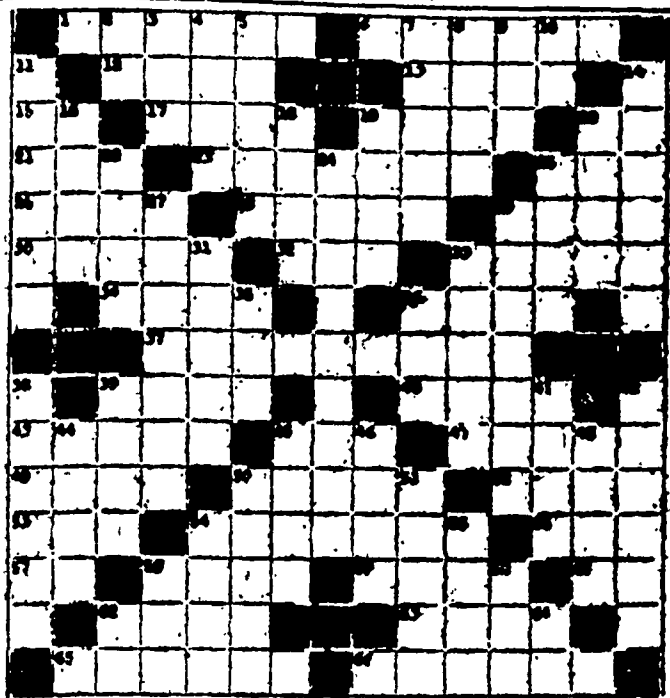

CAR THIEVES FACE A FEDERAL CHARGE

Instead of being taken back to Minneapolis to stand trial for stealing a Buick sedan there last Monday night, Donald Willard, 16, and Robert O'Shaughnessy, 30, captured here Friday, will go before the federal court at Dubuque for violation of the Dyer act—transporting a motor vehicle from one state to another, knowing it is stolen.

They were arraigned before U. S. Commissioner Stoddard at 3 p. m. Saturday and bound over to the grand jury. U. S. Deputy Marshal Healy transferred them from the police station to the county jail Sunday to await the Dubuque term of court.

When men from the Minneapolis police department arrived Saturday night to get O'Shaughnessy and Willard, they found the federal authorities wanted the pair here, so returned with only the stolen car.

O'Shaughnessy, a former convict, and Willard were caught here through the aid of Gill Frink, Mechanicsville farmer, whose truck they collided with on the Lincoln highway near that town. When the auto bandits refused to pay Frink for the damages to his car, he jumped in and rode with them to Cedar Rapids, despite their threats that they would "bump him off" with the .35 caliber revolver they carried in the car. On the way in he became convinced that they were driving a stolen car and when they stopped at a local garage, he notified the police.
