

Better Times For Beef Industry May Not Be Fable This Time

DEPT. OF AGRICULTURE SAYS FACTS BEAR OUT PREDICTIONS

Both Production and Demand Now Favorable to Cattleman; Six Of Eight Good Years Are Now Generally Prophesied.

WASHINGTON, April 27.—Is the beef cattle business about to round the much talked of "corner" at last? Cattlemen have heard words of encouragement and cheer for some time. Breed publications have buoyed up the spirits of the purebred beef cattle breeder. Government estimates have shown that production has about run its course in the range country. Yet it has been a poor year for both the feeder and breeder.

The United States department of agriculture, in a statement issued today, however, proclaims that signs of the times point unmistakably toward a considerably better time this spring. This prediction is based not on logic but on actual happenings in statement declared.

The price of beef cattle has not risen in spite of increased slaughter. This reflects an increased demand for beef. Another favorable influence affecting the market for beef is the reduced hog marketing which means a broader market for beef. Credit conditions are much improved in the range country. Operating expenses on ranches have decreased because of the low cost of feed. The hard conditions of the last few years have also not increased efficiency in the handling of beef. There are distinct signs of light at the end of the tunnel for the beef cattle industry. The price of beef cattle has not risen in spite of increased slaughter. This reflects an increased demand for beef. Another favorable influence affecting the market for beef is the reduced hog marketing which means a broader market for beef. Credit conditions are much improved in the range country. Operating expenses on ranches have decreased because of the low cost of feed. The hard conditions of the last few years have also not increased efficiency in the handling of beef.

Slower To Liquidate. In 1922, 1923 and 1924 the beef cattle industry was subjected to the same forces that produced heavy liquidation in other farm enterprises. Liquidation in the case of cattle, however, was retarded by the fact that except in the range country, the number of head would have been liquidated but not only to the cattle men but to their creditors. In consequence the beef cattle supply to the market has been reduced.

The estimated number of all cattle on farms and ranges on Jan. 1, 1925, was 63,928,000, or nearly 1,000,000 head less than the number on farms a year previously. This was the estimated net decrease in the supply. Beef cattle declined from 41,726,000 to 39,699,000 or more than 2,000,000 head. An increase in milk cows reduced the total net decrease of cattle.

"Another light on the decrease in the potential beef supply is given by statistics showing the estimated number of head cattle in twelve range states. Unless they are being restocked a shortage of beef cattle is only a matter of time. So far they are not being restocked, but are being depleted of cattle. The estimated number of head cattle in the twelve range states on Jan. 1, 1925, was 13,819,000 compared with 14,890,000 a year before.

Although the number of head cattle on farms and ranges declined materially last year, the production of beef and veal increased. Federal inspectors reported production of beef in 1924 was 1,824,000 pounds, or 10 per cent more than in 1923.

Encouraging conditions are found on the demand side of the beef market. A year ago the beef industry was handicapped by competition from hog producers who were marketing immense quantities of pork at low prices. This is no longer the case.

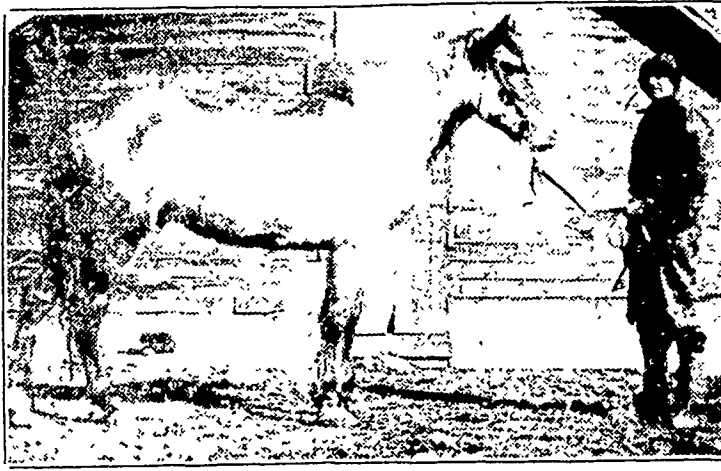

MAN BOUGHT A BULL CALF BUT WHICH ONE?

Jury Unable To Decide In Unusual Jackson County Case; Plaintiff Sues For \$950.

Special to The Gazette. MAQUOKETA, April 27.—The case of Peter Pankratz of Mountain Lake, Minn., against C. E. Tilton, farmer of this vicinity, concerning the sale of a registered bull, still remains unsettled as the jury has been unable to reach an agreement after a seven-hour deliberation.

The case attracted considerable attention here as Mr. Tilton is widely known for his Shorthorn breeding operations at one time serving as president of the Shorthorn Breeders' association. At present he is a doctor.

He is the owner of Galford, champion famous son of Marquis, a bull whose reputation is known wherever Shorthorns are raised.

Which Bull Did He Buy. In January 1924 Peter Pankratz purchased a registered bull of Mr. Tilton for \$400. Mr. Pankratz alleges that the bull he bought was not shipped to him, but another one that he had refused. He testified at the trial that he had purchased Galford (last night) the bull he bought was not shipped to him, but another one that he had refused.

Mr. Tilton and his witnesses testified that the animal bought and therefore shipped was Galford. The jury was unable to reach a verdict.

Mr. Pankratz asked judgment for the amount paid in the transaction for loss suffered in his herd of cows for delay in service and for expense incurred by him in obtaining another sire, the total amount asked being \$950.

George J. Janssen of Cedar Rapids represented the plaintiff while Ely and Gregory of this city acted for the defendant.

ANNOUNCE PREMIUMS FOR IOWA STATE FAIR.

DES MOINES, April 27.—(By Associated Press.)—Cash premium offers for this year's Iowa state fair, amounting to \$127,480 were announced by the state fair board today.

The total for the open classes, which includes prizes for virtually all agricultural exhibits and competitions, is \$115,569 and the total offered for the boys and girls' department is \$10,911. In the educational department, \$1,069 is offered for exhibit prizes and \$160 for the spelling contest.

WASHINGTON, April 27.—(By Associated Press.)—Organization of the Federated Farm Women of America was completed here Saturday after the delegates had been received by President Coolidge and Secretary Jardine.

The purpose as set forth in the tentative draft of the constitution is to "establish the peace, happiness and prosperity of the farm homes, to enlist as members, groups, associations or individuals in a national organization which shall be strictly non-political and essentially educational and economic in character."

The organizing committee plans to start an active campaign in June to get 50,000 farm women in the union.
