If the publicty of crime be suppressed, it would only be a matter of time before a shroud of secrecy would be demanded for the courts. That would defeat justice utterly. The origin of the courts was the idea that violations of the law should be aired in public. The administration of justice became the people's affair. They created courts and administered justice by proxy through judges and juries. Secret courts never could foster

This writer, like many others, wishes most heartily that he might not have crime stories thrust before his eyes, but this much desired end is not to be accomplished by sticking our heads in the sand, by pretending that no crimes are committed, by suppressing news. Publicity is like fresh air. It drives out disease. Before the invention of the printing press, crime was so prevalent and so various, capital punishment had to be prescribed for thousands of crimes.

We must continue to face the actual facts of life, and face them more intelligently and bravely. In fighting for a suppression of crime, we must not withdraw the blazing light of newspaper publicity. That would give criminals the protection of darkness and would lead to secret courts. If people must not read, they must not hear about crime. If sentiment should decree that it is determental to society to know about crime, that decree would apply equally to the newspapers, to the courts and to ordinary conversation. We might make ourselves so ridiculous as to pass a law to punish a citizen for reporting a crime
