CRIMSON WILL TRY TO BEAT PURPLE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR

Tullis Likely To Mount Peak In Mt. Vernon Setto; Dope All In Favor Of McPartland's Tribe; Lineup Will Be Unchanged.

HOSTILITIES between Coe and Cornell will re-open again tomorrow afternoon when the Crimson and Purple nines clash on Ash field in Mount Vernon. The game scheduled for Tuesday is the one that was postponed by rain last week.

The Kohawks will not only attempt to add another win to their mid-west record but will endeavor to score their first athletic victory over Cornell this present school year. The Methodists romped on Moray Eby's gridmen while the Purple cage forces twice vanquished Bert Jenkins' cagers.

Dope Favours Coe. Taking past performances into account, the Kohawks are favored to carry off tomorrow's decision. Cornell was dumped in defeats by Monmouth and Knox while Coach McPartland's tribe split the same teams in games last week, taking Knox into camp Saturday, 2 to 1, after facing Monmouth 7 to 4, the day before.

Tullis May Pitch. McPartland undoubtedly will nominate Dale Tullis for slab operations against the Purple. Otherwise the local nine will stand up as before. Captain Buckton will handle matters behind the box with Shipton, Lühring, Hughes and Maykever manning the inner defense. Johnson, Martin and Rhodes are down for the garden beds.

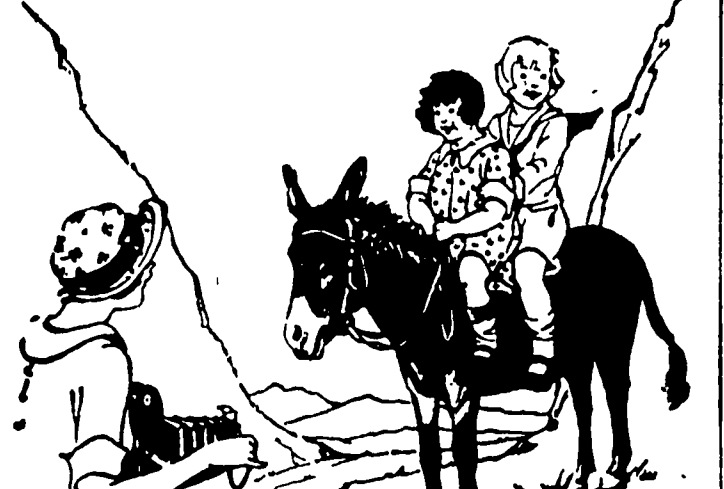
Plans Go Forward For Motor Races On Marion Track
