If the animal is pushed in order to get it in bloom pushed in order to get it in bloom for the fall fair it must be feed from twelve to fifteen pounds of corn. three pounds of barley, one and one-half pounds of linseed of meal and only a little clover hay every day If the barley is not available the ration should include slightly more corn. This, of course, is a heavy feed but will be necessary if most of the calves are to be in show shape.

Mr Day advised using a small amount of molasses, diluted with water, on the grain feed as an appenecessary There is nothing as good for sore feet as leading the animal through the grass a short time every morning. This cools the feet more effectively than any other measure Warbles shoul be squeezed out as they worry the calf and detract from the value of the hide.
