LOSS OF MILLION IN TWO FRISCO FIRES
One fireman killed, To Unconscious Fighting Flames; Candy Plant And Stockyards Are Damaged.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 15.—(INS)—One fireman was killed, two were rendered unconscious by smoke and damage estimated at more than \$1,000,000 was done by two fires in San Francisco early today.

The first fire destroyed the plant of Berg Brothers, confectioners, on Clay street, near Montgomery. Damage was estimated at \$100,000. While the Berg Brothers' fire was still burning, a disastrous fire broke out in the packing house district in South San Francisco, sweeping four large packing plants and causing damage estimated at \$1,000,000.

Lieut. J. C. Herlihy of the fire department rescue squad, died in the blaze which destroyed the Berg brothers plant. Herlihy was trapped in a water and smoke-filled basement for more than 4 minutes before he was rescued by tried to reach him. Several squads of firemen attempted to reach the trapped man but were driven back by heavy fumes.

When finally reached, Herlihy was found backed against a wall with his hands grasping an elevator shaft to keep his head above water. He was pronounced dead on arrival at the Washington high school.
